From the desk of the Administrative Chair

On Wednesday, January 21st, we will be having our second All School Parent Evening. It will follow a similar format to last year's program. Parents of students in grades 1-7 will begin by meeting in the classroom. Parents of students in grades 8-10 will meet in the common room of the Upper School, which is located in the Yellowwood Building. Parents of students in the Children's Garden will meet in the Music Room in the Tamarind Building. After presentations by the class teachers (or, in the case of the upper school, with the class advisors), you will then move from class to class following a schedule similar to your child's. You have the opportunity to hear presentations from a variety of the subject teachers. The program will begin formally at 7:15 p.m., but please join us in the lobby of the Tamarind Building for light refreshments before the program begins.

This edition of the Weekly includes a copy of the schedule for the next school year. It is not a complete schedule, but it shows the dates when classes start and when the school is closed for the various breaks throughout the school year. Next year, the school year will begin for the lower, middle and upper schools on Wednesday, September 2. The school year will begin for the 5 day Children's Garden classes on Thursday, September 3 and for the 3 day classes on Tuesday, September 8. These dates will be posted on the school calendar on the website shortly, and a complete calendar showing holidays and in-school celebrations will be published later in the spring.

Dr. P.M. Forni, a well-known "civility guru" and an award-winning Johns Hopkins University professor, will speak on Thursday, January 29, at 7 p.m. in Gilman School's Alumni Auditorium. The event, sponsored by the Gilman Parents Association, is free and open to the public. Forni's remarks will offer practical advice on how to limit the occurrence of rudeness and its potential negative impact

on everyday life. Among the topics covered will be the major arguments for choosing to be civil, the root causes of incivility and the ways to use civil behavior on the path to success in life. Forni's 2008 book, *The Civility Solution: What to Do When People Are Rude*, has been described as a "self-defense manual" against rudeness. "Civility and good manners are areas of human behavior where altruism and self-interest merge," says Dr. Forni. "If we teach youngsters in all walks of life how to manage conflict with civility-based relational skills, we will have a less uncivil society and a less violent one."
