

Job Description

Position: Children's Garden Lead Teacher

General Description of Post:

The CG Lead Teacher will teach, full-time, a class within the framework of the Waldorf School of Baltimore's philosophy and curriculum. They will create a classroom atmosphere where learning, cooperation, kindness, sharing, caring, respect and tolerance are encouraged. They will assess progress of students on an on-going basis. They will maintain regular communication with parents describing projects, expectations, written progress reports, and special events. They will conduct parent-teacher conferences on a scheduled and as-needed basis. They will participate in all-school and Community events and activities.

Authority: The CG Lead Teacher has the authority to:

- Carryout the responsibilities of the position as described below.
- Inform the Academic Director of problems and issues which may interfere with the ability to carry out the responsibilities below.

Responsibility: The CG Lead Teacher responsibilities include but may not be limited to:

Instructional Environment

- Planning all daily class schedules/routines
- Preparing and maintaining classroom, class materials, and class records (e.g. progress reports, child observations, and attendance).
- Maintaining a clean, orderly, safe, and attractive room.
- Managing Cost-Center budgets and ensuring tools, equipment and resources are well maintained and replenished as needed.

School & Families

- Engaging families in a professional, articulate and forthright manner.
- Maintaining regular communication with parents through notices sent home describing projects, expectations, written progress reports, incident/accident and other reports, and special events.
- Planning and conducting regularly scheduled and as-needed conferences and class meetings.
- Working with the Class Parent and parent volunteers.
- Completing, well-written, accurate trimester and interim reports for parents while meeting all deadlines and expectations, as described by the Academic Director,
- Planning, conducting, and attending regular class meetings and other class activities such as parent nights.

• Initiating home-visits with new students and current students as necessary before the first day of school, with the flexibility to accommodate parents' and teachers' vacation schedules.

<u>Curriculum</u>

- Working with the Academic Director or delegated others to develop a full curriculum and materials.
- Following the school curriculum.
- Planning and integrating artistic, handwork, and movement skills.
- Planning and executing activities and events suitable to the curriculum.
- Planning and participating in Festivals as appropriate.
- Attending/being fully engaged in training and development opportunities as directed and appropriate, including participation in the East Coast WECAN conference.

Teachers/Staff/Administration

- Work with Academic Director or delegated others, teachers and other staff to make on-going decisions about students and program implementation.
- Timely completion of accident/incident/behavioral reports, reporting to the Academic Director.
- Hold regularly scheduled mentoring sessions with Assistant/s as agreed.
- Attending appropriate regularly scheduled faculty/staff meetings and other Community events such as admissions and outreach activities.
- Maintaining timely communication with the office providing information about planned events and changes to calendar schedules.
- Maintain accurate records of money spent on events, classroom materials purchased, and other expenditure.
- Social get-togethers for parents and students before school begins are encouraged.
- Consider serving as a member of Collegium based on Collegium's mandated membership criteria.
- Serve as representative on School committees and to professional groups on a mutually agreeable schedule. (first-year lead teachers do not sit on committees).
- Familiarize and/or deepen an understanding of the Waldorf program and anthroposophy and actively participate in faculty studies
- Read and abide by the policies, procedures and expectations contained in the Employee Handbook.

Personal qualities, knowledge, and skills needed:

- Undergraduate degree or equivalent
- Willingness and ability to develop a range of artistic skills.
- Effective classroom management skills
- The commitment and dedication to take up the work to strengthen diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout the school on an individual and collective basis.
- Willingness to engage in on going professional development in Waldorf training, workshops, and other professional development opportunities
- To develop and work from an understanding of anthroposophy

- Ability to work collaboratively with colleagues
- Strong interpersonal skills to communicate with students, parents, colleagues, and visitors
- Flexibility, stamina, creativity, patience, and a sense of humor

Preferred:

- Completed WECAN approved Waldorf Early Childhood teacher training, or currently enrolled or willing to enroll in a Waldorf teacher training program
- Previous classroom experience
- Previous experience working in a Waldorf School

Accountability (supported by and reports to):
